THREAT LEVEL CHANGES: SEOC LEVEL 2 – HEIGHTENED AWARENESS

Significant Issues:

Wildland Fires

SEOC has been in regular contact with jurisdictions and agencies engaged in wildland fire operations in the state.

The community of Cooper Landing, in the Kenai Peninsula Borough, remain on “SET” due to increased activity on the Swan Lake Fire. The SEOC continues to support the Kenai Peninsula Borough Emergency Management efforts and Swan Lake Fire operations.

On Friday August 23, Governor Dunleavy issued a State Disaster Declaration for the Matanuska Susitna Borough and Kenai Peninsula Borough for impacts from the McKinley, Deshka Landing, and Swan Lake wildfires. The Declaration activated the State’s Public Assistance, Individual Assistance, and Temporary Housing programs. SEOC is engaged in operations to implement these programs in the declared areas.

To date SEOC has received local declarations for fire response and recovery from:

- Mat-Su Borough
- Lake and Peninsula Borough
- Kenai Peninsula Borough

The Alaska National Guard are currently conducting the following missions in response to SEOC resource requests:

- Traffic management, in coordination with the Alaska State Troopers, for the Swan Lake and Caribou Lake fires in the Kenai Peninsula Borough. Alaska National Guard personnel are currently augmenting the Swan Lake Fire traffic management mission.
- Alcantra Armory operations in support of wildland firefighter lodging and logistics.

Water Shortages

The SEOC is assisting communities who have reported shortages of potable water within the Lake and Peninsula Borough and Kenai Peninsula Borough.

2019 Fire Season

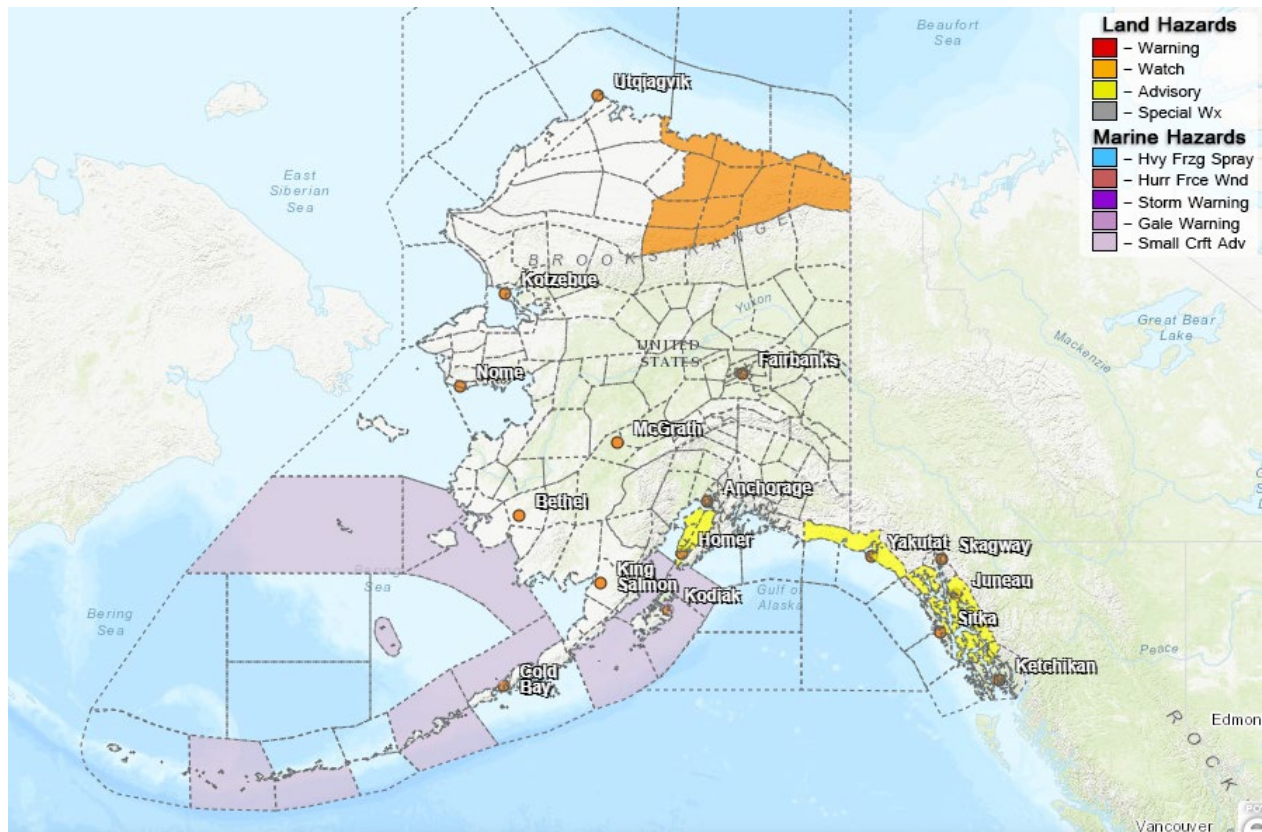
The Alaska Interagency Coordination Center, (AICC) is at Preparedness Level 3.

Wildland fire totals for 2019:

- Total Fires = 684
- Total Acres = 2,573,320.4 There are currently 209 active fires with 10 fires currently staffed.

Significant Weather:



A Dense Smoke Advisory remains in effect for the Western Kenai Peninsula and Prince William Sound.

A Flood Watch is in effect for all North Slope rivers from the Kuparuk River eastward through Friday, August 30. Areas affected will be the central and eastern Beaufort Sea Coast, and the northeastern Brooks Range.

A Dense Fog Advisory is in effect for Southeast Alaska until 11 am today.

Travel Alerts and Conditions

Parks Highway: Stop and Go traffic is expected from mile post 76 to mile post 99. Expect delays due to emergency vehicles on the road.

Sterling Highway/Seward Highway junction to milepost 71: Travel is not advised due to poor air quality. Pilot car operation are in effect but status can change, no stopping along the roadway. Watch for firefighting personnel in the area.

Road closure on Skilak Lake Road from Lower Skilak Lake Road to Sterling Highway due to emergency vehicles on road and smoke conditions.
